The Event shall be a **State Championship Race Event** held under the current FIA International Sporting Code including Appendices, the National Competition Rules of Motorsport Australia, the Circuit Race Standing Regulations (CRSR), the Supersprint Standing Regulations, the Regularity Trial Standing Regulations, the Regulations for 5th Category Historic Cars, The 2026 Tasmanian Circuit Racing Championship Regulations, The 2026 Tasmanian Supersprint Championship Regulations, The 2026 Tasmanian Racing and Sports Car Regulations, these Supplementary Regulations and any Further Regulations and or instructions issued for the Event.

6. ENTRIES / DETAILS

- a. Entries open upon publication of these Regulations and close at **5pm Friday November 20, 2026**. Entry Fees as per Article 5 above. Entries are not accepted until the receipt of completed entry form, associate paperwork and prescribed Entry Fee.
Preferred entry is via the Motorsport Australia Event Entry portal. Paper Entries upon request to the Secretary of the Event.
- b. Motorsport Australia Event Entry or paper Entry Forms must be completed in full, accompanied by the correct payment and lodged prior to the close off date. Late entries may be accepted. The Organisers reserve the right to refuse any entry, in accordance with the NCR.

- c. All cheques (no cash through the mail, please) are to be made payable to the Light Car Club of Tasmania and are not considered received until honored. A fee of \$50.00 will apply for a dishonored cheque.
- d. Competitors must complete and return the following forms with their entry for it to be accepted.
 ALL Competitors-Proof of club membership.
 All log booked vehicles must provide a completed Statement of Vehicle Compliance.
 All non-log booked Regularity and SuperSprint vehicles must complete the Self-Scrutiny checklist.
 Please return all documents to the Organisers by email.
- e. Notification of withdrawal by written confirmation prior to the start of the Event - Full Refund
 No refunds are issued for withdrawals after 9am on Friday November 27, 2026.
- f. As per usual arrangements, access to the circuit will be available without passes for competitors and officials before briefing commences.
 Competitors will be provided with 2 gate passes for each day on request **ONLY** at Drivers Briefing. You are welcome to leave your passes at the gate for your valued guests. Gate keepers have been asked to only allow pass holders into the circuit after the commencement of the Event each day.
- g. All Competitors **MUST** have **APPROVED COMPETITION NUMBERS** only and comply to **Schedule K of the Motorsport Australia Manual**.
 Regularity and SuperSprint Competitors may have placement on rear side windows instead of doors and additional competition numbers are also required on the front and rear windscreens in a dayglow yellow colour, as per Schedule K.
- h. Requests for Competition Numbers for circuit racing (including Regularity & SuperSprint) are to be made in writing to the Tasmanian Race Panel by email to the Chairman at sctas@motorsport.org.au As per 2026 Tasmanian Circuit Racing Championship Technical Regulations.
- i. Competitors are reminded that any Markings on Automobiles must comply with all civil regulations. Note that all advertising of smoking products is banned in Tasmania. As the event takes place in a public place, no sign promoting smoking products can be displayed.

7. SESSIONS

- a. It is proposed that over the two days of the Event, all **Racing** Entrants will have one Practice Session, one Qualifying Session plus four (4) Races.
- b. It is proposed that over the two days of the Event, **Regularity** Entrants will have one Practice session plus four (4) Trials.
- c. It is proposed that over the two days of the Event, **Super Sprint** Entrants will have one Practice Session, one Qualifying session plus four (4) Sprints.
- d. The Event Program will be advised in Further Regulations.

8. AWARDS

- a. Awards shall be allocated on the basis of number of starters for each group in the following manner:
1st, 2nd, 3rd for Five (5) or more starters / 1st, 2nd for Four (4) starters / 1st, Three (3) or less starters.
- b. Event Points:
For the avoidance of any doubt and misunderstanding, qualifying and event points will be calculated using the schedule as per the 2026 Tasmanian Circuit Racing Championship Regulations.

9. SCRUTINY

- a. Targeted Scrutiny will be in operation at this event and vehicles that are part of this program are required to bring evidence of such to Document Check in the form of a documented logbook. Vehicles which are yet to have their initial Targeted Scrutiny audit will be required to undergo initial scrutiny.
- b. The Chief Scrutineer may check vehicles and apparel anytime during the Event

10. QUALIFYING

- a. Timed Qualifying will take place on Saturday only and will be the basis for determining grid positions for the first race. These sessions will be time certain and will not be extended in the event of a red flag. Grid positions for subsequent races will be determined by the finishing order of the preceding race (with non-finishers and non-starters being added at the rear of the field at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course). The Organisers reserve the right to vary, combine, or add to practice and or competitive sessions, subject to the approval of the Stewards and in accordance with the Motorsport Australia Compatibility Matrix.
- b. Starting order for combined race grids will be determined by qualifying times.
- c. Each Driver must achieve a lap time within 130% of the fastest lap time recorded in that qualifying session/s or as otherwise prescribed in the Rules. Any Driver failing to meet the qualifying time criterion must apply to the Stewards who may grant permission to compete in accordance with Motorsport Australia CRSR.

11. SUPER SPRINT

- a. **Track Density.** The track density for Super Sprint events is 16 vehicles.
- b. **START PROCEDURE – refer to Article 14 of the SuperSprint Standing Regulations.**
 - i. When called Cars will assemble in the Marshalling Area in order of fastest to slowest time based on their fastest individual lap from their preceding session.
 - ii. Prior to each Sprint a 1 Minute Board will be shown.
 - iii. Cars will then proceed in single file onto the circuit at suitable intervals as directed for a Warm-up lap. Overtaking is not permitted, and the release intervals must be maintained on the Warm-up lap.
 - iv. Cars will line up in their assigned grid position and follow the starters' instructions.
- c. **RESULTS**
 - i. The winner of each Sprint will be the Driver who completes a lap in the quickest time. The distance will be detailed in the Event Schedule.
 - ii. The Overall event winner will be the Driver who completes a lap during the event in the quickest time. Drivers' times will be ranked by class and overall to identify standings for the Event.

12. REGULARITY

- a. **Track Density.** The track density for Regularity events is 56 vehicles.
- b. **Nomination of minimum lap time.** The Organisers have nominated a minimum lap time of 68 seconds.

13. TASMANIAN SPORTS GT

Tasmanian Sports GT A – Open to cars that are faster than 60.0 seconds per lap at Symmons Plains
Tasmanian Sports GT B – Open to any car that does not break 60.0 seconds per lap at Symmons Plains
Tasmanian Sports GT C – Open to any car that does not break 65.0 seconds per lap at Symmons Plains.

All SPORTS GT cars will be required to carry a fluoro yellow letter designating their class on their windscreen under their number to assist spectators, officials and commentators to better recognize the various classes.

14. LICENCES

- a. **Racing** Drivers must hold a minimum of a current Motorsport Australia Circuit Licence with provisional endorsement or superior. Holders of Provisional Circuit Racing Licences are reminded of the following regulation.
As of 1 January 2023, provisional circuit licence holders will not be able to drive a vehicle with a power-to-weight less than 3.5kg/kw
- b. **Regularity & SuperSprint** Drivers must hold a minimum of a current Motorsport Australia Speed/Speed Junior Competition Licence and be a minimum of 14 years of age.
- c. **All** Drivers must have proof of current membership of a Motorsport Australia affiliated Club.
- d. No licenses will be available for issue at the Circuit.
- e. Motorsport Australia Vehicle logbooks, Historic Technical Passport's (HTP), and Certificate of Description's (COD) must be presented at **Scrutiny** and be available, if required, for inspection at any other time during the course of the Event. Scrutineering will take place in the Scrutineering Bay at the rear of the carports.

15. COMPULSORY DRIVERS' BRIEFINGS

- a. Drivers Briefings will be held as follows and attendance is compulsory:
0815hrs Saturday 28 November 2026
0815hrs Sunday 29 November 2026
- b. Drivers are required to sign-on at briefing on the appropriate form.
- c. Anyone failing to sign on or tampering with the sign-on of another driver will be called to the Stewards of the Event.
- d. Please refer the [Motorsport Australia Circuit Race Standing Regulations](#) for the penalty for non-attendance.

16. CHANGE OF DRIVER

A change of Driver may be permitted subject to the NCR. **See the Secretary of the Event if a Driver change is required.**

17. WITHDRAWING FROM A SESSION/EVENT

If a competitor is unable to commence a session, they **MUST SUBMIT** a Withdrawal from Event form as soon as practical to the Clerk of Course showing intent on rejoining or withdrawing from the event in its entirety.

18. NOISE EMISSION

All competing vehicles must be fitted with an effective muffler and are **not to exceed** a noise level of **95dB (a)** on the standard 30 metre run-by test.

19. CHANGE OF PROGRAMME

The Organisers reserve the right to vary the Event Schedule under Circuit Race Standing Regulations.

20. JUDGES OF FACT

- a. The Judges of Fact in respect of the start / finish and noise emission shall be the Clerk of the Course, Deputy and Assistant Clerks of the Course, Secretary of the Event, the Chief Timekeeper, the Chief Scrutineer, the Starter and Assistant Starters.
- b. Judge of Fact for speed in the Pit Lane and driving over kerbs will be notified by Bulletin.

21. FIRE EXTINGUISHERS, OIL SOAK AND VENUE DAMAGE

Each competitor will be required to have in their Pit Garage or Paddock area a fire extinguisher complying with the Circuit Racing Standing Regulations.

Racing competitors are reminded of the change to Schedule H for 2026 requiring the fitment of a fire extinguisher to the competition vehicle. <https://www.motorsport.org.au/media/news/detail/2023/08/14/fire-extinguisher-updates-for-circuit-competitors>

Competitors will be required to pay for the servicing of any fire extinguishers used on their vehicle and for the replenishment of any oil soak used to clean up any spills they have caused. Competitors will also be responsible for the Cost or Insurance Excess for remediating any venue damage charged to the Organisers.

22. ABANDONMENT, POSTPONEMENT & CANCELLATION

The Organiser reserves the right to abandon, postpone or stop the Event in accordance with the NCR.

23. TIMING

All Race, Regularity and Super Sprint competitors will be timed by the way of DATA-1 transmitter. All Competitors will be required to carry a transmitter during practice, qualifying and racing. Transmitters are available from Dorian Industries, Factory 1, 29 Graham Court, Hoppers Crossing Vic 3170 Phone 03 9931 1371 Competitors are reminded it is their responsibility to advise the timekeepers of their Dorian transmitter number prior to entering the track.

A number of Transponders will be available for competitors for a hire fee of \$50 for the weekend. Competitors should purchase a Micro Mount from Dorian Industries before the event to mount to their vehicle.

Anyone entering the track without advising the timekeepers of their Dorian transmitter number will not be timed for that session and maybe subject to a charge for failing to comply with the request of an Official.

24. FUEL

Fuel must comply with Schedule G of the Motorsport Australia Manual.

Fuel will not be available at the Circuit.

25. INSURANCE

Certain public, property, professional indemnity and personal accident insurance is provided by Motorsport Australia in relation to the event. Further details can be found in the Motorsport Australia Insurance Handbook, available at www.motorsport.org.au.

26. OH&S

The Event will be conducted under and in accordance with Motorsport Australia OH&S, Safety 1st, Integrity and Legal, and Risk Management Policies, which can be found on the Motorsport Australia website at www.motorsport.org.au.

27. PROTESTS

Any protests must be lodged in accordance with the NCR.

28. MEDICAL

Medical requirements will be in accordance with Article 3.1.4.3 Alternative Medical Service/Requirements of the Motorsport Australia Medical Service Requirements at Motor Sport Events.

29. GENERAL

a. Integrity

Smoking (which includes e-cigarettes and “vaping”) and any naked flame is prohibited within 3 metres of any refueling/defueling operation.

Motorsport Australia’s National Integrity Framework and any associated policy (including the Australian Anti-Doping Policy, Motorsport Australia’s Illicit Drugs in Sport (Safety Testing) Policy, the Motorsport Australia Alcohol Policy), apply to any activity authorized by Motorsport Australia as published at www.motorsport.org.au.

Any Participant including the holder of a Motorsport Licence (or a Licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of alcohol, any drug or other banned substance. In addition to any penalty imposed by Motorsport Australia, a further penalty/s may be applied by Sport Integrity Australia.

Consumption of alcohol is prohibited until all Competition is concluded each day.

- b. Pit Lane speed limit shall be 40 kph.
- c. Pit lane direction. *At no time is it permitted to travel along pit lane under motive power in a counter direction to normal flow.*
- d. Due to pedestrians of all ages and capabilities, paddock speed limit for ALL vehicles shall be walking pace – for guidance consider this to be 10 km/h however all officials will be Judges of Fact in relation to paddock speed, and it is understood that they will not have speed detection devices, and their good judgement will be relied on.
- e. Chaplain A Motorsport Australia Chaplain will be in attendance during the Event and will be available to provide support and pastoral care to any driver, official, competitor, support crew member, or any other person in attendance at the Event.

30. PIT | PADDOCK

- a. The Circuit will be open at 7.00am on Saturday November 28th
- b. The Pit/ Paddock Area at Symmons Plains is limited. With control and your co-operation, we can accommodate Race Cars and Tender Vehicles. A limited area is available for transporters, motor homes and camping within the confines of the Paddock Area. Only one tender vehicle per Entrant will be allowed into the Paddock Area during the event.
- c. PIT / PADDOCK Marshals will be available to assist with all below.
- d. ALL TRAILERS should be parked in the "Trailer Park" at the rear of the Paddock Area on concrete pad.
- e. **GARAGE** hire cost is per car, and you will share the garage with one other competitor – should you have any preferences please leave a note with your entry in the Event Entry system, these must be BOOKED and PAID with your entry as limited number available. Garage will be allocated at the discretion of the Promoter; however, best efforts will be made to meet your requests.
Competitors are further reminded that any power cords between garages and service vehicles must not be left unprotected on the ground. They must be either on ground commercial protected cableways or by use of a catenary at least 2500mm above the ground.
- f. **ANY ACCESS to the circuit for competitors prior to the above mentioned date and time for vehicle drop off only (NO GARAGE ACCESS), and only IF AVAILABLE can only be made via arrangements with Motorsports Tasmania.**

DRIVER BRIEFING NOTES

These notes are to be read in conjunction with the National Competition Rules (NCR's), Circuit Race Standing Regulations (CRSR), Regularity Trial Standing Regulations, Speed Event Standing Regulations, Supplementary & Further Regulations and Bulletins that have been issued for this meeting.

- Please ensure you and your Pit Crew are signed on. ONLY drivers and pit crew who are aged 16 years and over will be allowed access to Marshalling and pit lane.
- Competitors, please note you are responsible for the actions of all persons associated with your entry, not just your nominated pit crew.
- All competitors are reminded that the onus is on them to present themselves to the marshalling area, *well in advance of their event* as listed in the program. In general this will be immediately after preceding session has commenced.

Any competitor failing to present to Marshalling at the appropriate time will start the session from pit lane.

- Listen for and respond promptly to PA Calls.
- If a competitor is unable to commence a session, they **MUST SUBMIT** a Withdrawal from Event form as soon as practical to the Clerk of Course showing intent on rejoining or withdrawing from the event in its entirety. These are available in Race Control.

Start Procedure

Qualifying

Will commence as soon as the cars are released from pit exit. Do not stop on the grid. Cars may commence practice & qualifying from their pit lane garages. Please note that these sessions will be time-certain in the event of a red flag.

Races

Handicap Start – To be confirmed

All other races and Super Sprints will be Non-Championship Standing Starts

- a) The start procedure shall be per CRSR Non-Championship Standing Start. The one-minute board will be shown in the marshalling area and there will be one formation lap from the marshalling area to the grid. There are NO FILL-UP GRIDS.
- b) Cars must not weave as they come to the grid after the exit of Turn 6. In particular cars must not complete tyre warming/burnouts from rolling or standing start at any time after they leave the pit lane on their warmup lap until the start signal is given.
- c) When the starter is satisfied with the grid, a 5 second signal will be shown. The start will be signified by extinguishing the RED light.
- d) False Starts: The position of the front wheels in relation to the grid box and laterally will be a determining factor in respect to a false start. Cars must be stationary with the front wheels on or within the grid box at the time of the start signal.

Regularity

From Marshalling, cars will proceed in formation leaving a minimum of 2 or 3 car lengths between cars. If the Starter is satisfied, a Full Course Green light/Flag will be displayed as the leader approaches Turn 7. This will give you time to get to your desired speed prior to the Start/Finish line. REMEMBER REGULARITY IS NOT RACING.

Flag Signals

- e) Session finishes: The chequered flag will be shown at the Control line.
- f) Red Flag will be displayed at all flag points. During Practice/Qualifying, reduce speed immediately and return to Pit Lane with caution. Overtaking is prohibited. In a Race cease racing and proceed with caution to Pit Lane.

- g) Observe the flag signals shown from the Flag points around the circuit.
- h) The Clerk of the Course flags "Chequered Flag, Bad Sportsmanship and Black Flag" are displayed at the control line.
- i) Blue flags will be used during practice & qualifying and in races in the case of lapping.

Recovery

- If you break down on the circuit, find a safe position off the circuit for your car. If it is safe to do so, leave the vehicle and move to a safe position behind protection. **DO NOT** cross the track. **Do not attempt to fix the vehicle.**
- If the safest position is in the car, stay there wearing all safety equipment and stay strapped in.
- In all situations, please indicate to the official that you are OK with a thumbs up.

Pit Lane

- a) Smoking is not permitted in the paddock and pit lane area at any time during the meeting.
- b) Any person entering the pits and marshalling must be correctly attired, shorts, short sleeve shirt and closed shoes as a minimum.
- c) A speed limit of **40km/h** will apply in pit lane at all times.
- d) During the start and the first lap of the race, only race officials are permitted at the signaling wall.
- e) The Pit Lane signaling area is not a spectator area.

Code of Driving Conduct

- a) Competitors are reminded of the provisions of the Code of Driving Conduct CRSR which has been revised for 2024. Time Penalties may be imposed by the Clerk of the Course for Breaches of the Code of Driving Conduct during the Race. In many cases these penalties cannot be appealed refer CRSR
- b) If there is any overlap, you must leave at least one car width between your car and the edge of the track at the exit of a corner.
- c) It is not permitted to gain advantage as a result of contact with another car.
- d) Breaches of the Code of Driving Conduct may be referred to the Stewards of the Meeting.

Other

- All Competitor Record books are to be handed to the Secretary of the Meeting on Saturday morning and may be collected at the conclusion of the event.
- Any party involved in contact between two competing cars must report to the Assistant Clerk of the Course located in the Control Tower
